

Aurora Sandringham Dividend Income Trust (ASX Code: AOD) Aurora Dividend Income Trust (APIR Code: AFM0010AU) Performance Report - February 2012

Summary

- The strategy returned 1.4% for February compared to the Benchmark which returned 1.1%
- Since inception, the strategy has returned 6.6% per annum versus the S&P/ASX200 Accumulation Index which has returned 2.2% per annum over the same period

On January 31 2011 the AOD Trust commenced investing via the unlisted Aurora Dividend Income Trust. The performance information within this newsletter is that of the Aurora Sandringham Dividend Income Trust.

Investment Objective

To provide investors with returns in excess of the S&P/ASX 200 Accumulation Index including the value of franking credits over rolling 5 year periods with around half the volatility.

Investment Strategy

The Investment Strategy seeks to achieve the investment objective by investing in an actively managed portfolio of fully franked dividend paying companies listed on the Australian Securities Exchange while hedging the market exposure to around 50% of net assets. The Aurora Sandringham Dividend Income Trust invests into the Aurora Dividend Income Trust.

How to Invest

The Investment Strategy can be accessed through either of two ways. The first is through the ASX listed Aurora Sandringham Dividend Income Trust, that was established in November 2005 and trades under the ASX Code: AOD. The second is through an unlisted managed fund, the Aurora Dividend Income Trust (ARSN 151 947 732, APIR Code: AFM0010AU).

Portfolio Commentary

Global equity markets continued January's strong performance underpinned by a perceived lessening of European risk and US economic data which continued to surprise on the upside. The local market underperformed global markets in part due to the high Index weighting of the Materials sector which underperformed on signs of cooling Chinese demand. A lackluster local reporting season also failed to ignite the market and overall, the S&P/ASX200 Accumulation Index finished up 1.9%.

With companies going ex-dividend post their earnings announcements; the Trust accumulated significant franking credits during the month. Telstra was amongst the best performing positions due to a solid earnings result and a high fully-franked yield.

Also contributing to performance was the Trust's overweight position in the Energy sector with Middle East tensions pushing up Oil prices while gas prices remained flat. Woodside Petroleum was amongst the best performing positions as it reported good progress on its LNG projects and a material upgrade to its Browse resource.

Detracting from performance was the underperformance of the large banks due to a mixed set of results which overall revealed greater than expected margin pressures.
