



Aurora Global Income Trust (ASX Code: AIB) Performance Report - April 2012

Summary

- The Trust returned 1.1% for April compared to the UBS Australia Bank Bill Index which returned 0.4%
- The Trust has returned 5.5% p.a since inception versus the UBS Australia Bank Bill Index which has returned
 4.8% p.a over the same period

The above composite/hybrid performance summary reflects a combination of the performance of the investment strategy as it applied (net of fees) within the former Aurora Sandringham Global Income Trust (ARSN 131 291 499 - now terminated) since its inception in July 2008 to 30 November 2010, and then the performance of this Trust (which implemented the same strategy) since 30 November 2010 to date. This is not the actual performance of Aurora Global Income Trust (AIB). The actual return of AIB since inception is 3.1% p.a. The table above and the charts below refer to the performance of the composite/hybrid strategy and not of the actual performance of AIB.

Investment Objective*

To provide investors with steady income returns after fees and expenses in excess of the UBS Australia Bank Bill Index over rolling three year periods while protecting their capital. Please note that while we aim to achieve this objective, the returns are not guaranteed.

Investment Strategy

To take advantage of global companies that Aurora expects will increase in value relative to the market around the announcement of their quarterly, half-yearly and yearly earnings results while hedging their market and currency exposure.



Portfolio Commentary

Global Equity markets fell during April as a political backlash against European austerity plans gained momentum. Europe indices fell to 3 month lows as French president Nicolas Sarkozy lost the first round of elections with anti-euro, anti-austerity candidates winning a large share of the vote. This was followed a day later by the resignation of the Dutch PM and his cabinet after the coalition government failed to reach agreement on budget cuts. US indices outperformed after stronger than expected earnings overshadowed lackluster economic releases including disappointing labour market figures.

The strategy's best performing sectors were Industrials, Energy and Utilities while Telecommunications, Healthcare and Materials were the worst performing. The strong performance in the US was supplemented by some good results in Sweden which exhibited signs of mean reversion after it was one of the weakest countries last quarter.

Finnish elevator and escalator company Kone was the

strategy's best performing position as it overcame a challenging pricing environment to significantly beat estimates. It outperformed by 15% with the 1st quarter order intake of €1.37b surpassing consensus estimates by 23%. SanDisk which manufactures solid state storage for mobile devices underperformed by 17% and was the strategy's worst performing position after forecast revenues were worse than expected with a recovery not expected until the second half of 2012 when new products from leading manufacturers start shipping. Margins were also well below estimates with an industry oversupply causing prices to fall.


