Investment Objective

The Aurora Global Income Trust ("Fund") seeks to achieve absolute returns and income through the use of several different global investment strategies. The focus on absolute returns differs from traditional funds in that the Fund aims to produce returns not correlated with market conditions or global market indices.

Investment Strategy

The Fund seeks to take advantage of market mispricing and arbitrage opportunities using a diverse range of investment strategies. The Responsible Entity of the Fund researches various criteria for each investment, including fundamental and quantitative analysis, company event situations such as takeovers and mergers, earnings announcements, demergers and restructuring, liquidity events, recapitalisations, multiple share classes, option availability and pricing. The Fund will invest in opportunities that are considered to offer attractive risk return characteristics with a focus on potential catalysts that seek to generate a profitable return regardless of the market direction. The Fund may use derivatives for risk management as well as to create new positions and may opportunistically short sell securities that may be overpriced or to reduce risk on the overall portfolio.

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Fund performance summary

- The Aurora Global Income Trust ("AIB" or "Fund") returned -7.91% for the month against its benchmark return of +0.12%.
- The Fund finalised its takeover bid for HHY Fund (ASX:HHY) during the month, with 14.7% of HHY's unitholders accepting the Fund's bid and becoming unitholders in an enlarged Fund.
- The key contributor to the Fund's performance was a long volatility position held in Ellerston Global Investments Limited (ASX:EGIO), which primarily benefitted from an appreciation in its underlying equity market exposure.
- The key detractors from performance this month were ASX:HHY and Molopo Energy Limited (ASX:MPO).
- The Funds HHY position was acquired using HHY's prevailing Net Asset Value ("NAV") which represents the underlying value of this investment. HHY has however been marked in AIB's portfolio at the ASX traded price consistent with all other market traded securities held by the Fund.
- Currently, HHY's ASX traded price is at a discount to its NAV. HHY recently announced a buy-back for up to 10% of its units on issue which, in our view, should see a material contraction in the discount between HHY market price and underlying NAV. All else equal, this would result in an improvement in AIB's reported NAV.
- AlB's position in MPO was revalued at 13.5 cents (versus it's previously held 14.0 cent) during the month. This value is consistent with the recent off market bid for MPO by the Aurora Fortitude Absolute Return Fund (AFARF), which in Aurora's view and based on all available information to date, is the most appropriate carrying value for this position.
- ASX:MPO currently remains and will remain suspended, according to the company, until such time that the ASX is satisfied that MPO meets the ASX Listing Rule requirements.
- Effective 1 October 2017, the Administrator for the Fund will change to Aurora Funds Management Limited.
- The Fund incurred extraordinary costs, in the form of legal fees, during the month.
- <u>Correction</u>: The August 2017 newsletter identified ASX:MPO as being a detractor to performance. This was incorrect. The key detractors to performance in August 2017 were Copper Strike Limited (ASX:CSE) and Antipodes Global Investment Company Ltd (ASX:APLO).
