

Aurora Global Income Trust (ASX Code: AIB) Performance Report - May 2012

Summary

- The Trust returned -4.6% for May compared to the UBS Australia Bank Bill Index which returned 0.4%
- The Trust has returned 4.1% p.a since inception versus the UBS Australia Bank Bill Index which has returned 4.8% p.a over the same period

The above composite/hybrid performance summary reflects a combination of the performance of the investment strategy as it applied (net of fees) within the former Aurora Sandringham Global Income Trust (ARSN 131 291 499 - now terminated) since its inception in July 2008 to 30 November 2010, and then the performance of this Trust (which implemented the same strategy) since 30 November 2010 to date. This is not the actual performance of Aurora Global Income Trust (AIB). The actual return of AIB since inception is 2.0% p.a. The table above and the charts below refer to the performance of the composite/hybrid strategy and not of the actual performance of AIB.

Investment Objective*

To provide investors with steady income returns after fees and expenses in excess of the UBS Australia Bank Bill Index over rolling three year periods while protecting their capital. Please note that while we aim to achieve this objective, the returns are not guaranteed.

Investment Strategy

To take advantage of global companies that Aurora expects will increase in value relative to the market around the announcement of their quarterly, half-yearly and yearly earnings results while hedging their market and currency exposure.

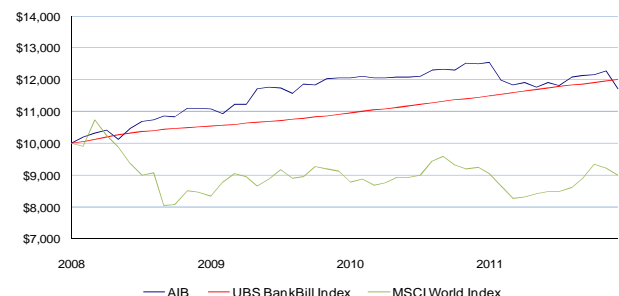

Portfolio Commentary

Global markets fell 1.8% during May as political uncertainty and a larger than expected deterioration in economic conditions in the US and China led to large falls in global equity markets. The turmoil was triggered by Greek elections early in May which failed to produce a government and also saw the hard-left, anti-euro party Syriza win a large share of the vote. This stalemate prompted uncertainty surrounding the potential for a Greek exit from the Euro and the impact that might have on the remaining members.

The strategy's worst performing region was the US where company forecasts frequently disappointed in line with economic releases which consistently missed expectations and indicated that the recent recovery is faltering. Europe - where expectations are arguably lower- was the strategy's best performing region. Information Technology, Energy and Materials were the strategy's worst performing sectors while Utilities, Telecommunications and Consumer Staples were the best performing sectors.

US retailer Petsmart, which outperformed the market by 15.0%, was the strategy's best performing position. It comfortably beat earnings expectations as an increase in advertising spend had a positive impact on sales while margins still grew in part due to a shift toward more premium pet food. The strategy's worst performing position was storage and data management solution provider NetApp which underperformed the market by 20.9%. Earnings came in ahead of expectations; however company forecasts for first quarter revenues were significantly below expectations with management pointing to a weak macro environment particularly within Europe.

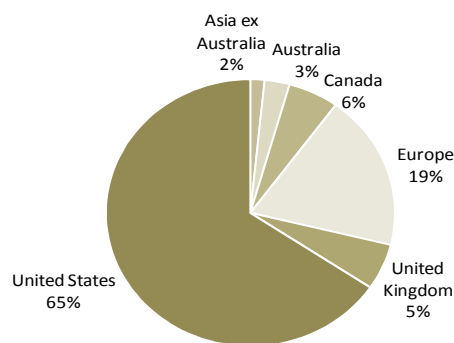
